TNQ RFN's core business is to develop the capacity of members through the creation of opportunities, strengthening of networks and management of resources.

The TNQ RFN proudly showcases the diversity and quality of foods grown and produced in this region. In June 2022, a FIAL (Food Innovation Australia Limited) grant was completed, providing much needed funding and support which will allow further strategic and marketing activities to continue developing local business and industry.
